

WHAT AM I VOTING FOR ON NOVEMBER 3RD?

Here are some of the people Pennsylvanians will be voting for and why their jobs matter to you. (Your ballot depends on where you live, so you may not see every office listed below on yours.)

U.S. REPRESENTATIVE

What they Do? They represent your part of Pennsylvania in the U.S. Congress in Washington, D.C. They vote on national laws and how the federal government spends your tax money.

This can affect: Taxes, healthcare, Social Security and Medicare, education, immigration, public health, transportation, jobs and federal programs.

We vote: Every 2 years.

PA GOVERNOR

What they Do? They lead Pennsylvania, can sign bills into law or stop them with a veto, and propose the budget for how the state spends money.

This can affect: Schools, roads and transportation, healthcare, jobs, public safety, childcare, environmental protections and state services.

We vote: Every 4 years, together with the Lieutenant Governor (see below).

PA LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR

What they Do? Think of this role as Pennsylvania's version of the Vice President. They are second in command, can cast the deciding vote when there is a tie in the PA Senate, and become Governor if the Governor can no longer serve. They also lead the PA Board of Pardons.

This can affect: State laws when there is a tie in the PA Senate, pardons and who leads Pennsylvania if the Governor can no longer serve.

We vote: Every 4 years, together with the Governor (see above).

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
